School Based Instructional Coach

Hello and welcome to a brand-new school year. My name is Mr. Korecki and this is my second year at Riverside. My role is the school-based literacy coach formally known as the Dream Catcher coach. Together with our teachers I work to support our students through literacy. This year, Saskatchewan Rivers School division has made some changes to our Home Reading Recommendations. These new recommendations will work to foster a love of reading. We encourage our families to read with your child everyday – children love to choose their own books to listen to. Talk with your child about what you are reading. And, encourage your child to read to you. This might be a few words, a page or even a whole book. We now know the focus of home reading should be experiencing a wonderful story together, rather than reading for a prescribed amount of time. Sharing a book together helps put focus on rich language development.

Language skills can also be developed through playing, learning and growing together. This includes activities like playing, dancing, talking, cooking or tidying up.

Did you know that your child's brain is almost fully grown when they are just six years old?

When you help your child learn before age six, you are building a foundation of social, emotional, physical and academic skills that will last a lifetime.

Activities like dancing, singing, talking, reading, playing and exploring with your child help to build their cognitive skills, language skills, spatial and math concepts, social skills, empathy, motor skills and problem-solving skills.

Dear Parents/Guardians:

LETTER OF FAIR NOTICE – Prince Albert Risk Assessment Protocol

The Saskatchewan Rivers Public School Division Board (SRPSD) is committed to providing safe learning environments for all students, staff, school visitors and community members. We believe that by working together with students, their families, and the community, we can support young people to be healthy and happy.

Our principals, vice-principals and school social workers receive training developed by the <u>Centre for Trauma Informed Practice</u> to lead a process called Assessment of Risk to Others (ARTO). This training has led to the development of a community protocol to help principals protect students from potential threats to safety or serious harm. The protocol helps schools respond quickly to threatening incidents.

The Prince Albert Community Risk Assessment Protocol outlines how schools will respond to threatening or worrisome behavior. Principals will convene a School Risk Assessment Team, which typically will include the principal/vice-principal, a school counselor and a police officer. Depending on the severity of the potential threat, principals may also consult with the Superintendent of Schools and call in members of the Community Risk Assessment Team. This Community Team may include representatives of community agencies such as local Police, Mental Health and Addiction Services, or Child and Family Services.

Parents and guardians will be notified as soon as possible in the ARTO process. If parents/guardians cannot be reached or if they choose not to provide consent, the risk assessment may still proceed. Personal information shared throughout this process will respect and balance each individual's right to privacy with the need to ensure the safety of all.

This letter is to serve fair notice that SRPSD will take decisive action when a serious threat has been made. Our goal, as always, is to ensure student safety in a caring learning environment.
